Welcome to Lincoln Cathedral

We are delighted to welcome you to Lincoln Cathedral for the investiture of the Reverend Canon Nick Brown Precentor of Lincoln, and for the making of two Chapter members as new lay canons. A particular welcome to family, friends and congregation who have come to support those being invested and installed today.

Earlier this afternoon the Precentor and canons designate made the Declaration of Assent and swore the Oaths of Allegiance, and the Bishop of Lincoln collated them as canons of the cathedral. We gather now for their investiture and installation.

Much of this afternoon's service is sung by the choir and follows a set pattern which is offered daily in the cathedral. Its essence is praise: words, inspired by God, used to worship him and lift our minds and hearts. The singing of psalms and the reading from the Old Testament unite us with our spiritual ancestors, the Jews, and with Jesus Christ, who himself used them to praise God. Our meditation on the word of God leads us to Jesus who is the Word made flesh, and so the *Magnificat* - a song of praise first sung by Mary, the mother of Jesus - acts as a pivot, pointing us to the new relationship with God which is brought about in the birth of Christ. The remainder of the service celebrates that 'new covenant' and, in the intercessions, commits us to the life of service to which Christians are called. If the service is new to you, we hope that in the prayerful combination of words, music and silence you will find space for meaningful reflection.

As is our recent custom, all services are now being live streamed on the cathedral facebook page.

A hearing loop is in operation in the cathedral. Where applicable, please adjust your hearing aid to 'T' if you wish to make use of this.

A retiring collection will be taken. The College of Canons

Since Lincoln Cathedral was founded in 1072, it has always been the seat *(cathedra)* of the bishop and a centre of worship and mission for the diocese. The work of the College of Canons is to support and carry out the bishop's apostolic ministry throughout the diocese and beyond.

Lincoln Cathedral has fifty-three canonries. In mediaeval times each was paid a *prebend*, or salary, consisting usually of the income from a manor or holding of land. Each canon is still known by the name of his or her prebend, which is written on a tablet above the seat, together with the Latin title of the psalm which should be recited daily "if nothing hinders". This means that between the whole College of Canons the entire psalter is recited daily. The bishop says Psalm 1.

Normally four canons of the cathedral are residentiary, looking after the Cathedral's worship, education programme, visitors and building. The other forty-nine are either clergy or lay people who hold leading positions in the church, mostly but not exclusively in the diocese.

The four residentiaries at Lincoln are the Dean, Precentor, Chancellor and Subdean. Together with a priest of the diocese, the chairman of the finance committee and three lay persons, all chosen for their expertise, they form the Chapter, which is the Cathedral's governing body.

The College of Canons exists to give counsel to the bishop and to the Chapter on any matter concerning the cathedral as the seat of the bishop. It receives and considers the annual report and audited accounts of the cathedral and discusses such matters concerning the cathedral as may be raised by its members. In the event of a vacancy in the See of Lincoln the College of Canons is responsible for electing the new bishop.

Precentor of Lincoln

The Reverend Canon Nick Brown Prebendary of Carlton cum Thurlby

As a Residentiary Canon of the Cathedral, the Precentor takes overall responsibility on behalf of Chapter for the organisation and development of the worship and musical life of the Cathedral. The post holder is one of the two residentiary posts funded by the Church Commissioners for whole-time ministry in the Cathedral. As a Residentiary Canon, the Precentor is a member of the Cathedral Chapter, sharing fully the responsibility for all aspects of the Cathedral's life.

He is already a familiar face to many in the Cathedral as a non-residentiary canon and holds strategic oversight for safeguarding on behalf of Chapter.

For the past eight years Nick has been Rector of Louth and latterly Rural Dean of Louthesk. He has also been a member of the Bishops' Diocesan Council of Trustees. In Louth, he has overseen the life and work of both the civic church of St James, social outreach from the Trinity Centre, and the spiritual lives of churches in the surrounding villages. Before moving to Louth Nick was based in the diocese of Salisbury with a variety of roles in the parish, diocese, and the cathedral. He is married to Lucy and they have two sons, Ben and Ollie.

The Installations

Farendon

Mrs Harvey Dowdy Cathedral Chapter

The Nottinghamshire churches of Farndon and Balderton formed part of the Bishop of Lincoln's soke or jurisdiction of Newark, which was in his possession at the time of the Domesday Survey in 1086. They were confirmed as a prebend of the Cathedral by the pope in 1163. Farendon was a comparatively wealthy prebend, valued in 1291 at £53 6s 8d. The first recorded prebendary was Master John of Coutances, no doubt a kinsman of Bishop Walter of Coutances, who was installed before 1184. Among his successors were the sonorously-named Cinthius de Pinea de Urbe, successively Bishop of Tripoli and Archbishop of Capua during the thirteenth century; Peter Dalton (a residentiary canon and Treasurer of Lincoln) who at his death in 1402 bequeathed a silver cup to Katherine Swynford, Duchess of Lancaster; and Robert Sanderson, Rector of Boothby Pagnell, who was appointed Bishop of Lincoln in 1660 and played a significant part in the compilation of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer.

Bedford Minor

Mr Stuart Welch Cathedral Chapter

Before 1086 Bishop Remigius acquired a hide of land in Bedford from the church of St Paul in that town and this was confirmed as a possession of the canons of Lincoln in 1139. By the end of the thirteenth century, this land had become the endowment of two prebends, known as Bedford Major and Bedford Minor. Among those who have held the latter stall have been Dr Thomas Clifford, one of those commissioned to examine members of the Knights Templar after the suppression of their Order; Simon Grene *alias* Foderby (Precentor of Lincoln 1512-1528) who owned a manuscript copy of Robert Grosseteste's treatise on the Ten Commandments, now in the Cathedral Library; Moses Terry, whose handsome memorial may still be seen in the south choir aisle; and Thomas Trevenen Penrose whose sister-in-law Elizabeth, authoress of the best-selling *Mrs Markham's History of England*, lies buried in the Slype.

The Bishop's Commission

The canons designate move to stand before the bishop and are presented to him.

Right Reverend Father, we present to you these persons who have been appointed and collated canons and prebends of this cathedral church. They have taken and subscribed the oaths and declaration required by law, and we ask that they may now be invested and installed.

BISHOP'S CHARGE

The bishop addresses the chancellor and canons designate and delivers his formal charge to them.

The office of a canon carries with it certain responsibilities.

A canon should be a holy person, who prays regularly for God's blessing upon the work of the church in this diocese, and who enters wholeheartedly into the tradition of those who have served God before us through the worship offered in this Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

A canon should be a faithful, discreet and well-informed adviser to the bishop; one who confesses Jesus as Lord, whose studies are founded in scripture and disciplined to the discovery and advancement of truth.

A canon should be hospitable, welcoming strangers and the poor, sharing the generous love and modesty that mark a disciple of Christ.

Bishop Will you try, with the help of God, to be such a person?

Canons- With the help of God, I will.

designate

Bishop Almighty God, who has put into your heart to make these solemn promises, give you grace to perform the same, that you, with your brothers and sisters, may inherit everlasting life.

All Amen.

The precentor designate moves to stand before the bishop and is presented to him.

Right Reverend Father, we present to you the Reverend Canon Nick Brown, who has been appointed and collated as precentor of Lincoln. He has taken and subscribed the oaths and declaration required by law, and we ask that he may now be invested and installed.

The bishop hands the Letters Mandatory to the precentor and canons designate and says

Take this our mandate, which you shall cause to be handed to the Very Reverend Christine Wilson, dean of our Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln; in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All **Amen.**

The precentor and canons designate bow to the bishop.

The Investiture

The precentor and canons designate stand before the dean, to whom they hand the Letters Mandatory of the acting bishop of Lincoln.

The canons designate say

Madam Dean and members of the Chapter, I present these Letters Mandatory of David our Bishop and ask you to admit, install and induct me into a Prebend and Canonry of this Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln.

The precentor designate says

Madam Dean and members of the Chapter, I present these Letters Mandatory of David our Bishop and ask you to admit, install and induct me as Precentor of Lincoln and of this Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln.

The dean passes the Letters Mandatory to the chapter clerk, who reads them out to the Chapter. The dean responds on behalf of Chapter

We gladly accept these letters from David our Bishop and ask you now to declare that you will accept the constitution, statutes and customs of this Church.

The canons designate make the following declaration

I, *N.*, who am appointed canon and prebend of this Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln, declare that I will faithfully observe the constitution, statutes and customs of this Cathedral Church, and that I will set forward and promote such works as may properly be done in connection with it for the service of God and for the benefit of his church. So help me God.

The precentor designate makes the following declaration

I, Nicholas James Watson Brown, who am appointed precentor of this Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln, declare that I will faithfully observe the constitution, statutes and customs of this Cathedral Church and cause them to be observed by others, that I will keep in this Church due residence according to law and that I will set forward and promote such works as may properly be done in connection with it for the service of God and for the benefit of his church. So help me God. The dean invests the new canons in turn, saying to each

In the name of God, Amen.

We, Christine Louise Wilson, Dean of this Cathedral Church, and these my brothers and sisters, receive you (here the Dean takes each new canon by the right hand) as a brother/sister, and admit you as a Canon and Prebendary of this Cathedral Church.

She puts the New Testament into each new canon's hand, continuing

... in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The dean invests the new precentor, saying

In the name of God, Amen.

We, Christine Louise Wilson, Dean of this Cathedral Church, and these my brothers and sisters, receive you (here the Dean takes him by the right hand) as a brother, and admit you as a precentor of this Cathedral Church.

She puts the New Testament into his hand, continuing

... in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The Installation

The new canons and precentor move to St Hugh's choir to be installed. The dean takes each new canon by the hand and leads them to their prebendal stall.

- Dean We install you, brother/sister, into the stall assigned to your prebend. The Lord keep watch over your coming in and your going out from this time forth and for evermore.
- All **Amen.**

The new canon stands and turns to look at the back of the stall and the dean continues

Look upon the titles of the psalms, which you are to recite every day, if nothing hinders.

The dean says to the new precentor

Nick, you have been called to serve God amongst us here as Precentor of Lincoln. I invite you to accompany me to the stall assigned to that office and dignity in this Cathedral Church.

The Cathedral Foundation says with one voice

May God give you grace to serve here as Precentor!

The precentor is vested in his cope by a member of Chapter and the dean leads him to the precentor's stall. The dean seats him in his stall, saying

We install you, brother, into the stall assigned to the precentor. The Lord keep watch over your going out and your coming in, from this time forth and for evermore.

All **Amen.**

The precentor and the new canons kneel and say, with the dean and the whole congregation, the Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Dean	O Lord, save your servants
All	who put their trust in you.
Dean All	Let the enemy gain no advantage over them nor the wicked approach to hurt them.
Dean	Be to them, O Lord, a strong tower
All	from the face of the enemy.
