When attending public worship, please remember to observe the measures to protect us all by following the measures that are in place inside the cathedral and complete the Track-and-Trace information.

Along with opportunities for public worship, the cathedral is open between 10am and 3pm from Monday to Friday, and from 11 30am to 3pm on Sundays. The Dean's Green will also remain available as a place for quiet and reflection from 10am to 4pm each day.

A few moments before the service is due to begin, the President welcomes the congregation and gives out any particular notices for the day. After this, all say the following prayer:

Come Lord Jesus, dwell in me and send your Holy Spirit that I may be filled with your presence. Amen.
