WELCOME TO LINCOLN CATHEDRAL

Along with opportunities for public worship, the cathedral is open between 10am and 3pm from Monday to Friday, and from 11 30am to 3pm on Sundays. The Dean's Green will also remain available as a place for quiet and reflection from 10am to 4pm each day.

A few moments before the service is due to begin, the President welcomes the congregation and gives out any particular notices for the day. After this, all say the following prayer:

But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation,
and share your bread with sinners.
So cleanse and feed us

and that we, with the whole company of Christ,
may sit and eat in your kingdom. Amen.**

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,

who with the Father and the Son
is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic
and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism
for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**
