Upcoming special services:

25th July

Solemn Eucharist for the Feast of James the Apostle, including organ music and the plainsong propers for the feast at 10am. This will also mark Colin Walsh's time as Organist Laureate and appointment as Organist Emeritus.

In the course of the service we give thanks for the contribution Colin Walsh has made to the cathedral's music over the past 33 years. Celebrating his especial contribution as organist, and his particular gift for accompanying the liturgy, this service will be an opportunity to participate in a eucharist that uses the organ to its fullest extent.

There is a long-standing tradition in the liturgical worship of continental Europe of the organ taking a part in the liturgy, accompanying the chants sung by the choir; providing a sensory background to the liturgy that both ornaments it and seeks to bring out its deeper meanings in ways that words alone cannot do. This tradition is particularly characteristic of the worship of cathedrals and abbeys of the French Church, and became most fully developed in the cathedral church of Notre Dame de Paris and the great Parisian churches.

It is from this tradition that our worship next Sunday takes its inspiration – combining sung chant and organ music to elaborate the liturgical celebration – which concludes with us all joining our voices in commitment to follow in the footsteps of James, as disciples of Christ.

The cathedral is also open for visiting between 10am and 4pm from Monday to Friday, and from 12noon to 3pm on Sundays. In the period before 10am and after 4pm, we ask people to respect the quiet and tranquillity of the building so that it can be a sanctuary for those who seek prayer and peace at these times.

Any indications for sitting, kneeling or standing are given for guidance. If you need to sit at any point during the service, please feel free to do so.

A few moments before the service is due to begin, the President welcomes the congregation and gives out any particular notices for the day. After this, all say the following prayer:

All **Most merciful God,
your love compels us to come in.
Our hands were unclean,
our hearts were unprepared;
we were not fit even to eat the crumbs from under
your table.
But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation,
and share your bread with sinners.
So cleanse and feed us
with the precious body and blood of your Son,
that he may live in us and we in him,
and that we, with the whole company of Christ,
may sit and eat in your kingdom. Amen.**
