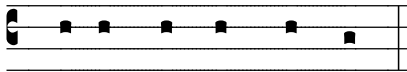

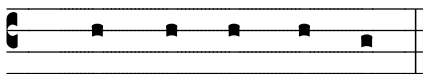

# The Liturgy of Initiation

## PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

*The candidate is presented to the congregation by their godparents.*

*The president addresses the whole congregation:*

Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome this child and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

*All*                    **With the help of God, we will.**

*The president then says to the parents and godparents:*

Parents and godparents, the Church receives this child with joy.

Today we are trusting God for his growth in faith.

Will you pray for him, draw him by your example into the community of faith, and walk with him in the way of Christ?

*Parents and  
godparents*            **With the help of God, we will.**

*President*            In baptism this child begins his journey in faith.  
You speak for him today.

Will you care for him, and help him to take his place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

*Parents and  
godparents*            **With the help of God, we will.**

## THE DECISION

*The president addresses all the godparents*

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

*Candidates*

**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

*Candidates*

**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

*Candidates*

**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

*Candidates*

**I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

*Candidates*

**I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

*Candidates*

**I come to Christ.**

## SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

*The president or another minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate for baptism, saying*

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

*All*

**Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ  
against sin, the world and the devil,  
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

*President*

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

*All*

**Amen.**

*The ministers and candidate for baptism gather at the baptismal font together with their close family and guests during the singing of the hymn.:*

Following all my ways.  
May I be always close to you

## PRAYER OVER THE WATER

*The president stands before the water of baptism and says*

*All* Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*All* **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.

By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

*All* **Amen.**

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

*The president addresses the congregation*

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess  
the faith of the Church, into which we baptise this child.  
Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

*All* **I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

*President* Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

*All* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

*President* Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

*All* **I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.  
Amen.**

## BAPTISM

*The president dips the catechumen in water, or pours water on them, saying*

George Edward, I baptize you  
in the name of the Father,  
and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit.

*All*        **Amen.**

*The president says*

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,  
pour upon you the riches of his grace,  
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people  
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,  
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

*All*        **Amen.**

## COMMISSION

*The president continues, saying*

We have brought this child to baptism knowing that Jesus died and rose again for him and trusting in the promise that God hears and answers prayer. We have prayed that in Jesus Christ he will know the forgiveness of his sins and the new life of the Spirit.

As he grows up, he will need the help and encouragement of the Christian community, so that he may learn to know God in public worship and private prayer, follow Jesus Christ in the life of faith, serve his neighbour after the example of Christ, and in due course come to confirmation.

As part of the Church of Christ, we all have a duty to support *them* by prayer, example and teaching.

As his parents and godparents, you have the prime responsibility for guiding and helping him in his early years.

This is a demanding task for which you will need the help and grace of God. Therefore let us now pray for grace in guiding this child in the way of faith.

Faithful and loving God,  
bless those who care for *these children*  
and grant them your gifts of love, wisdom and faith.  
Pour upon them your healing and reconciling love,  
and protect their home from all evil.  
Fill them with the light of your presence  
and establish them in the joy of your kingdom,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

*President* If you are worshipping with us online, you are invited to make your spiritual communion, praying that by God's grace, united with all the baptised and with Christ who gave his life for us, you may be filled with his indwelling presence.

**Act of Spiritual Reception to say at home:**

O loving God, in union with Christian people throughout the world and across the centuries gathered to make Eucharist, hearing your holy Word and receiving the Precious Body and Blood of your dear Son, I offer you praise and thanksgiving. Even though I am exiled from tasting the Bread of Heaven and drinking the Cup of Life I pray that you will unite me with all the baptised and with your Son who gave his life for us. Come Lord Jesus, dwell in me and send your Holy Spirit that I may be filled with your presence. Amen.

*Members of the baptismal party receive communion first, followed by their family and guests. The congregation then come forward to receive communion. Please follow the direction of the stewards.*

*All baptised Christians who usually receive communion are invited to do so. Please follow the directions of the stewards. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please carry this service booklet as a signal to the priest.*
