Introduction

WELCOME to Choral Evensong in Lincoln Cathedral!

A particular welcome to members of the Board of Education and the Headteachers of Church Schools of the Diocese of Lincoln, to their colleagues, families, supporters and friends, and to the officers of the Diocese. We are delighted to join with you in worship this evening.

The solemn worship of God, with all the resources and creativity at our disposal, is our core purpose, pointing to our belief in the centrality of God in the life of the world. The service follows a set pattern and its essence is praise: words, inspired by God, used to worship him and lift our minds and hearts. The singing of psalms and the reading from the Old Testament unite us with our spiritual ancestors, the Jews, and with Jesus Christ, who himself used them to praise his Father. Our meditation on the word of God leads us to Jesus who *is* the Word made flesh, and so the *Magnificat* acts as a pivot, pointing us to the new relationship with God which he brings about. The remainder of the service celebrates that 'new covenant' and, in the intercessions, commits us to the life of service to which Christians are called.

Much of tonight's service is sung by the choir, and there may be less active congregational involvement than you are accustomed to in other forms of service. We hope that in the combination of words, music and silence you will find a space for prayerful reflection and a recharging of spiritual batteries in the midst of our busy and often hectic world.

Please note that a hearing loop is in operation in St Hugh's Choir, and those with hearing aids should turn them to T during the spoken parts of the service.

Please stand as the choir and clergy procession enters.

The Commissioning of Headteachers

The Canon in Residence welcomes the congregation and invites them to be seated.

The Bishop stands before the altar and addresses the Headteachers, their friends and supporters, and the congregation informally. He continues

Brothers and sisters, Christ calls us all to follow him in our lives and to live out his love in our communities. We come here today, in worship and in prayer, to celebrate the particular ministry of those who serve in the Church Schools of the Diocese of Lincoln, and to commission for service Headteachers from our schools. Alongside them we give thanks for the work of the Board of Education, and commission the new Director and Assistant Director of Education for their roles.

As we gather in worship with those appointed to this ministry, we pray with and for them for grace to follow and serve God in their schools and their communities.

The Director of Education and Deputy Director of Education stand before the Bishop who introduces to the congregation.

The Headteachers stand before the Bishop. The Diocesan Director of Education presents them to him, saying

Bishop, I present to you these Headteachers of our Church Schools, asking that they be commissioned to that ministry.

Education is a key part of the church's mission in sharing the good news of the Gospel with all people. As both new and established headteachers, you have a special responsibility to ensure that everyone in your school is valued and recognised as a uniquely gifted child of God. You are also charged with ensuring that your school is rooted in Christian values, principles and beliefs; that worship and religious education are central to the life and work of the school; and that the Christian faith is reflected in every aspect of school life.
