WELCOME TO LINCOLN CATHEDRAL

This service, and the other sung services during the week, are available online and we welcome all those both near and far joining our worship as it is live streamed at: https://www.facebook.com/Lincoln.Cathedral

Any indications for sitting, kneeling or standing are given for guidance. If you need to sit at any point during the service, please feel free to do so.

All baptised Christians who usually receive communion are invited to do so. Please follow the directions of the stewards. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please carry this service booklet as a signal to the priest.

This service begins outside the Crown Court building within the castle, where the congregation is invited to gather ready to begin at 10 30am. If you are able, please bring branches with you to represent the palms that were strewn before Christ on his entry into Jerusalem. From the castle we will process to the front of the cathedral where the Gospel of the Passion will be read, before continuing into the cathedral for the Eucharist of Palm Sunday.

In the case of wet weather, we will begin inside the west end of the cathedral and process into seats in the nave of the cathedral during the first processional hymn. In this situation, the second procession (after the reading of the Passion) will not take place.

The Gathering

At 10 30am the choir sing the introit:

Hosanna to the Son of David, the King of Israel. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The congregation face the ministers for the beginning of the service.

GREETING

President Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father

and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you

All and also with you.

The president introduces the celebration:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

The people hold up palms or branches while this prayer is said by the president:

God our Saviour,

whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as Messiah to

suffer and to die;

let these palms be for us signs of his victory and grant that we who bear them in his name

may ever hail him as our King,

and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life;

who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

THE PROCESSION

PASSION READING MATTHEW 27.11-54

Please join in fully in the parts in **bold** type.

Evangelist The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Evangelist: Jesus stood before the governor; and the governor asked him,

Pilate: Are you the King of the Jews?

Evangelist: Jesus said, Jesus: You say so.

Evangelist: But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he did not

answer. Then Pilate said to him,

Pilate: Do you not hear how many accusations they make against you?

Evangelist: But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the

governor was greatly amazed. Now at the festival the governor was accustomed to release a prisoner for the crowd, anyone whom they wanted. At that time they had a notorious prisoner, called Jesus

Barabbas. So after they had gathered, Pilate said to them,

Pilate: Whom do you want me to release for you, Jesus Barabbas or Jesus who

is called the Messiah?

Evangelist: For he realized that it was out of jealousy that they had handed him

over. While he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to

him,

Pilate's Have nothing to do with that innocent man, for today I have suffered a

wife: great deal because of a dream about him.

Evangelist: Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for

Barabbas and to have Jesus killed. The governor again said to them,

Pilate: Which of the two do you want me to release for you?

Evangelist: And they said,

Crowd: Barabbas.

Evangelist: Pilate said to them,

Pilate: Then what should I do with Jesus who is called the Messiah?

Evangelist: All of them said,

Crowd: Let him be crucified!

Evangelist: Then he asked,

Pilate: Why, what evil has he done?

Evangelist: But they shouted all the more,

Crowd: Let him be crucified!

Evangelist: So when Pilate saw that he could do nothing, but rather that a riot was

beginning, he took some water and washed his hands before the crowd,

saying,

Pilate: I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves.

Evangelist: Then the people as a whole answered,

Crowd: His blood be on us and on our children!

Evangelist: So he released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed

him over to be crucified. Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they gathered the whole cohort around him. They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a reed in his right hand and knelt before him and mocked him, saying,

Soldiers: Hail, King of the Jews!

Evangelist: They spat on him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. After

mocking him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him. As they went out, they came upon a man from Cyrene named Simon; they compelled this man to carry his cross. And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they

had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots; then they sat down there and kept watch over him. Over his head they put the charge against him, which read, 'This is Jesus, the King of the Jews.' Then two bandits were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

Crowd: You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross.

Evangelist: In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking him, saying,

Crowd: He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he wants to; for he said, 'I am God's Son.'

Evangelist: The bandits who were crucified with him also taunted him in the same way.

From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice,

Jesus: Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?

Evangelist: that is,

Jesus: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Evangelist: When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

Crowd: This man is calling for Elijah.

Evangelist: At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink. But the others said,

Crowd: Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him.

Evangelist: Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. After his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many. Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said,

Centurion: Truly this man was God's Son!

At the end of the Passion the Evangelist says

This is the Passion of the Lord.

No response is made.

After a short time of silent reflection, the choir, ministers and congregation process to the body of the nave, whilst singing the following **Processional Hymn:**

Sing, my tongue, the glorious battle, Sing the ending of the fray, O'er the Cross, the victor's trophy, Sound the loud triumphant lay: Tell how Christ, the world's Redeemer, As a Victim won the day.

God in pity saw man fallen,
Shamed and sunk in misery,
When he fell on death by tasting
Fruit of the forbidden tree:
Then another tree was chosen
Which the world from death should free.

Therefore when the appointed fullness
Of the holy time was come,
He was sent who maketh all things
Forth from God's eternal home:
Thus he came to earth, incarnate,
Offspring of a maiden's womb.

Thirty years among us dwelling,
Now at length his hour fulfilled,
Born for this, he meets his Passion,
For that this he freely willed,
On the Cross the Lamb is lifted,
Where his life-blood shall be spilled.

Bend thy boughs, O Tree of Glory, Thy too rigid sinews bend; For awhile the ancient rigour That thy birth bestowed, suspend, And the King of heavenly beauty On thy bosom gently tend. Thou alone wast counted worthy
This world's Ransom to sustain,
That a shipwrecked race might ever
Thus a port of refuge gain,
With the sacred blood anointed
From the Lamb for sinners slain.

He endured the nails, the spitting, Vinegar and spear and reed; From that holy Body pierced Blood and water forth proceed: Earth and stars and sky and ocean By that flood from stain are freed.
