Instituted in 1264 and falling on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, the feast of Corpus Christi celebrates Christ's institution of the Eucharist. A number of the texts we use to celebrate the Eucharist emphasise the communicant's unworthiness to receive Christ's body and blood: for example, 'Lord, I am not worthy to receive you' and 'We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table'. Christians often fall into the trap of expressing this sense of our unworthiness, and then going no further. But none of these liturgical texts ends at this point. To quote the Prayer of Humble Access: 'But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy'.

In the Eucharist, the all-merciful God makes the first move by offering himself to us despite, and because of, our unworthiness. For me, this divine initiative is expressed most beautifully in George Herbert's poem, Love bade me welcome from his Five Mystical Songs:

LOVE bade me welcome; yet my soul drew back, Guilty of dust and sin.

But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack From my first entrance in,

Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning If I lack'd anything.

'A guest,' I answer'd, 'worthy to be here:'

Love said, 'You shall be he.'

'I, the unkind, ungrateful? Ah, my dear, I cannot look on Thee.'

Love took my hand and smiling did reply,

'Who made the eyes but I?'

'Truth, Lord; but I have marr'd them: let my shame Go where it doth deserve.'

'And know you not,' says Love, 'Who bore the blame?'
'My dear, then I will serve.'

'You must sit down,' says Love, 'and taste my meat.'
So I did sit and eat.

As we give thanks for Christ's institution of the Eucharist, let us remember that Christ's institution is also Christ's invitation, and is offered in love.
