In the various interactions I have with groups and organisations in Lincoln, it's interesting to see how many of them use an image of the Cathedral as part of their logo. Lincoln Pride and the YMCA's Nomad Centre are two examples I've come across in the past week.

The word 'iconic' can be overused, but there's no doubt that, in an important way, the Cathedral is an iconic building and, for many people, gives the city something of its identity. As the Cathedral community, it's important that we're not indifferent to that or take it for granted. The challenge for us is that, if that's true, how do we respond?

One way of responding is to commit ourselves to be more deeply engaged in the local community, to strengthen the relationships that already exist, and to look for opportunities to build new ones.

The Nomad Centre provides a good example of how this might be done. Situated in St Rumbold's Street, it seeks to provide safety, security and support to people who have nowhere else to live, so that they can build strong foundations for a positive future. Its work is inspirational, not least because it so clearly relates to the homeless not as a problem but as people.

The Cathedral has good relations with the Centre. We funded the purchase of its minibus, and I was thrilled to see one of our Cathedral volunteers serving lunch to the residents. For those who would like to volunteer with a local charity, the Nomad Centre is a very good option. At the moment they're looking for volunteers to serve meals in the early evening. If you're interested, let me know, and I'll gladly put you in touch.

Responsibility for our magnificent building and what goes on inside it is always going to be a priority for the Cathedral community, and rightly so. But let that go hand-in-hand with a genuine desire to look for generous and imaginative ways to serve the community that sees that same building as part of their identity.
