One of my favourite moments in services at the cathedral is when the huge west doors are flung wide open and the procession goes out into the big, wide world in view of the startled tourists on the west green. Recently that has included processions of newly ordained deacons and priests and new graduates of Bishop Grosseteste University. It is a spectacular symbol of mission – and in particular the mission to transform.

At the end of events like graduations and ordinations we don't just sit there proud of our achievements. We get out there because what is being marked and celebrated is the work that has been done with all those young and not so young people to equip them to be transformers of the world in a wide range of context and settings. Mission is about sending out, not about sitting inside and waiting for people to come to us. It's about getting out there to make a difference – often in tiny ways that Jesus talks about in the parables we have been hearing over recent Sundays, like a tiny mustard seed or yeast in the flour for bread or a little cache of treasure.

Many, many people come into the cathedral for a range of reasons – worshippers, tourists, pilgrims, concert and exhibition goers, those puzzled or struggling. The increasing quality of our worship, our hospitality and our compassion will, God willing, plant a seed in them, the fruit of which we may never see and may not even be able to imagine. And that is a lovely possibility, particularly when we see how hard people in the cathedral, worshippers, volunteers and paid staff, work to make our visitors' experience a good one.

This week sees the feast of the Transfiguration where the disciples are stunned by the vision of who Jesus really is. However, rather than hang around in the presence of all that splendid holiness, Jesus whisks his disciples off to get straight on with the transforming work of healing and teaching. Our cathedral is a place of beauty and inspiring worship, but it only makes sense as part of a mission to transform our often ugly and struggling world, offering that world the transforming words of the Gospel. **Sunday 23 July** Ninth Sunday After Trinity
