The Chapter Letter



SUNDAY 12 MAY - SUNDAY 26 MAY

This Sunday sits between two major church festivals: Ascension and Pentecost. Ascension being the day we remember Jesus' return to the Father after his resurrection, and Pentecost is when we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples - often known as the 'birthday of the Church'. The nine days between these two key celebrations, traditionally known as a Novena, offer us an opportunity for prayer and reflection as we pray for the renewed gift of the Holy Spirit for ourselves and our communities.

Pentecost is the festival of the Holy Spirit - that aspect of God that dwells within us and works for the transformation of all creation. In Scripture the word for Spirit is also the word for breath. In this way each breath becomes a prayer for God's presence.

Christians throughout the centuries have used breathing as part of a more conscious prayer practice, using phrases of Scripture or prayer with each in and out breath - a practice which has now also been shown to have good physical and emotional benefits as well as spiritual ones!

You may like to use this season to explore one of the traditional Christian breath prayers, such as the Jesus prayer, or to try a contemporary one, such as the one below, written by Amy Lovings and based on Romans 8:22-27:

The Apostle Paul tells us that the Spirit of God prays for us "with sighs too deep for words". Through the Life-Giving Breath of God, we are given all that we need.

Let us breathe deeply— inhaling the good gifts that God provides, and exhaling all of the things that we need to release.

Let us breathe in strength... And, let us exhale our exhaustion...

Let us breathe in freedom... And, let us exhale all that holds us back...

Let us breathe in a new sense of direction... And, let us exhale the paths we no longer want to use...

Let us breathe in hope... And, let us exhale self-doubt...

Let us breathe in unconditional love... And, let us exhale distrust and hate...

Holy Spirit, let us feel the mighty rush of your presence in this place. Blow away our fears and worries, and help us to breathe in your gifts of new life. Amen.
