#### A praying community

Each day at Evensong or Evening Prayer we say the words "...and so we pray the prayer laid down by St Hugh for the daily use of the canons of this Cathedral church...". That phrase is a reminder that Lincoln Cathedral has been a place of daily prayer for around 1000 years and that we have been praying his words for over 800. We join in prayer, here in this building, with Christians from centuries past and, I hope, centuries future, creating a rhythm of prayer through each and every day. There is something quite special in being a part of the community which holds and participates in this prayer – a community made up of our congregations and clergy, our volunteers and staff, and our visitors, tourists and pilgrims.

Alongside our set prayers in services, we are also a community that prays for each other, and for those who come to the Cathedral seeking prayer. The prayers written and left on our prayer boards in the Morning Chapel and at the Gilbertine Pots are gathered each week and prayed over by the celebrant each Sunday at our 10:30am service.

Specific Prayer requests are held in different ways. For ongoing prayer and where confidentiality is preferred, the Cathedral's Intercessory prayer group meet weekly to pray together and also pray individually for their list of people throughout the week at home.

Public prayer for others happens in two ways (both of which require the expressed permission of the person being prayed for, particularly as our main service is live-streamed).

Firstly there is a daily list read at each Eucharist. These requests can be for any reason and, moving forward, will be read out for a one-month period before being removed. If you would like continued prayer after that month, all you need to do is to reapproach the clergy, pastoral care team or the vergers to renew your request. This monthly contact gives us a chance to hear how things are for those being prayed for, and to offer any support or pastoral care which might be useful.

A smaller number of these daily names are also read out at the Sunday 10:30am service. Moving forward, this list is for those with strong Cathedral connections and their immediate families, and with whom we are in active pastoral contact. Prayers at this service will usually be for a short to medium term and at particular points of crisis or change (eg a new diagnosis, sudden deterioration of health, surgery, bereavement etc), after which, through conversation with the requestee, they will be moved to the daily list if ongoing and long-term prayer is desired.

These slight changes are being implemented to enable our community to continue praying fully and faithfully in a way that better supports our pastoral care and ensures that we can genuinely support each other in practical ways as well as through our prayers.
