Here at Lincoln, our Cathedral Community is vibrant, diverse and open; connecting to the wisdom of God and the diverse realities of daily life of our City and County; and reflecting the inclusivity, complexity and richness of the life of a cathedral, which welcomes people of all faiths and none to attend and, if they wish, participate in communal worship or to find a space for reflection, meditation or prayer.

Our community comprises worshippers, supporters, choristers and their families, volunteers, staff, local organisations and regular visitors. Each group brings distinct but vital gifts and roles to play. You may find yourself in one or many of these groups which make up our life together.

We are always exploring new ways of recognising and celebrating our community, and one of those is the development of a Cathedral Community Roll. The new Cathedral Measure requires us to keep a roll of those who worship at the Cathedral and invites us to create a list of other members of our Community. We are keen to adopt this more inclusive approach to reflect on the diversity of the membership of the community and, importantly, to help us improve communication with all who want to know what's happening at the Cathedral and be involved in its life.

If you'd like to join one or both of these rolls, please use the QR code below or collect a hard copy from the Cathedral or Chapter Office. Please do speak to one of the clergy or vergers if you need any further assistance.

Belonging to our Community Roll allows the Cathedral to contact you, and for you to opt-in to any of our regular communications. (In addition, you may also wish to join our Worshipper's Roll, which is similar to a Parish Church electoral roll, and allows us to connect as a congregation, and for those eligible to vote in elections for Deanery Synod representatives to do so.)

We hope that these new initiatives will help us to unite and strengthen the Cathedral Community.
