BIBLE READINGS

This week's Chapter Letter takes a bit more of a personal turn than normal, for which I hope people will forgive me!

Earlier in the month I graduated from the University of Durham – marking the end of a project that has provided me with stimulation and enjoyment over the last few years, and the satisfaction of having a doctoral thesis interrogated and approved. My studies have taken place against a background of changes that I had not foreseen when I first set out on the project in 2018! The background reading and research began in those halcyon, pre-Covid days well before I thought I would be moving from Louth to Lincoln, and, since moving to Lincoln, the writing up has provided me with a necessary distraction from the varied

With that project now concluded, and the practical demands of duties at the Cathedral becoming more settled with a dean and two residentiary canons in the post, I am looking forward to finding the space to take some time for reflection and refreshment. In 2019, I deferred a planned sabbatical period to 2020 (rather foolishly as it turned out!), and I am grateful that my colleagues within the clergy team and on Chapter are willing to make the space over the coming year for me to take some time away from my regular cathedral duties so that I can benefit from a time of extended study leave. Having focused on the experience of musicians in cathedrals, and how this is shaped by the institutions and history of the places in which they sing, I hope to spend this time of study exploring how this can be seen reflected in different ways in churches of other traditions - looking particularly at the experience of our Episcopal cousins in North America, and our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters in France and Austria/Germany. To enable this to happen, I will be spending two short periods away from my normal duties during February and June, and a longer period over the summer (which will also provide an opportunity for me to spend some extended time travelling with the family).

In parallel with this, and in the absence of a substantive Chancellor, I will also use the time to reflect on ways in which the Cathedral can develop further its existing relationships with academics and researchers. This builds on conversations that I began last year with the help of Peter Neil, and will hopefully see the Cathedral develop an Institute for Learning and Research as a way to engage with researchers, encourage academic study focusing on the cathedral and its life, and share the fruits of that learning. I hope that, alongside a time of refreshment and continued research, the time away from the day-to-day duties as Precentor will provide time to reflect and prepare for the initial stages of this project. To enable both my sabbatical leave and the work necessary to establish the Institute for Learning and Research, Chapter have agreed that the Cathedral look to appoint a part-time role of Succentor to share the work of organising and delivering the liturgical life of the Cathedral, and this post will be advertised shortly.
