**BIBLE READINGS** 

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Candlemas, when we remember Mary and Joseph taking Jesus to the temple 40 days after his birth, for Jesus to be presented and for Mary to be ritually purified. In this visit we hear the stories of Simeon and Anna meeting Jesus and seeing God's promise reflected in and through him, small and fragile as he was.

We too are called to look for and remember God's presence in the fragility of our human lives and world. We too are called to name, with gratitude and joy, places and people of hope, faith and peace: to notice light in the darkness, and love in the midst of fear; to notice God's inbreaking and upwelling in the apparently insignificant and ordinary moments of our days.

The seasons of Incarnation (Christmas and Epiphany), which end with Candlemas, remind us that God works in and through the small, the human, the daily, and the imperfect, to bring about his Kingdom and that we, like Simeon and Anna, are called to be witnesses to that presence. We are called, like Simeon, to affirm that we have seen the gift God has given us here and now, and to make his prayer our daily prayer. Here in the Cathedral, we pray this prayer, the Nunc Dimittis, at every Evensong. You may like to read it in Luke 2:29-32 or enjoy the paraphrase by Jim Cotter below:

An unfolding of the Nunc Dimittis
Thanks be to God, I have lived to see this day.
God's promise is fulfilled, and my duty done.
At last you have given me peace,
for I have seen with my own eyes
the revelation you have prepared for all peoples,
a light to the world in its darkness,
the glory of all who serve your love.
