**BIBLE READINGS** 

We're one cathedral with one mission. That's one of the main themes that runs through the work that I've been doing since September on the cathedral's vision and strategy over the next five years.

That there is only one Lincoln Cathedral is beyond doubt. That we have only one mission is a more complex statement, and one that needs some unpacking. To my mind, everything that we do, be it worship, education, conservation, events, and a whole lot more, is part of the cathedral's mission. Related to that, everyone involved in the cathedral's mission, including volunteers, worshippers and staff, are valued members of the

An alternative model is one that defines the cathedral's mission more narrowly, and sees our commercial activity as supporting that mission rather than being integral to it. The choice between these two was brought into sharp focus at Chapter this past week during a discussion of vision and strategy. We asked ourselves whether, if money wasn't an issue for us, and we had all the funds we needed to conserve the building and run the cathedral, would we still have such a broad range of events. The answer was a resounding 'yes'. Why? Because they are one of the principal ways in which we're able to engage with a broad cross-section of the community we seek to serve, welcoming large numbers of people into the cathedral, and opening up the possibility of visitors becoming pilgrims.

That we're one cathedral with one mission is just one of the strands that runs through this work on vision and strategy. Over the next couple of months there will be opportunities for the cathedral community to engage and respond to it before it's rolled out. The session for members of the congregation (although staff and volunteers are also welcome!) will be after Evensong on Sunday 9 March in the Chapter House. In the meantime, I'd like to encourage us all to reflect on our attitudes and behaviours in relation to the cathedral and its community, and what aspirations we have for the next five years. What can we do to help this community more effectively live out its vocation to be one cathedral with one mission?
