EXHIBITIONS

While you're visiting Lincoln Cathedral, head to the visitor centre and enjoy the handson activities in the Discovery Centre and take a look around our Exhibition Gallery.

During March and April, our temporary exhibition will be 'Women of Lincoln Cathedral', which takes a look at the women, from patrons to pilgrims, who have touched the life of Lincoln Cathedral over the centuries.

From Saturday 3 May to the end of July the exhibition will focus on the 1536 inventory, which lists all the precious items removed from the Cathedral, by Henry VIII's agents. Will the document itself is too fragile to be on display, local artists have been commissioned to create pieces of work inspire by the inventory and the many items which were taken.
