SUNDAY 25 MAY - SUNDAY 8 JUNE

This week on Thursday, the Church celebrates Ascension Day, the day on which we remember the Risen Christ returning to the Father. This day traditionally begins a novena (nine-day period) of prayer in which Christians pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit, anticipating the festival of Pentecost, but also praying for the life of the Spirit in our lives and world today.

Across the days between Ascension Day and Pentecost, we are invited to join together across the world in prayer and reflection using the resources of Thy Kingdom Come. These can either be downloaded from their website: https://www.thykingdomcome.global/resources-0, or hard copies are available to pick up from the tables on either side of St Hugh's Choir.

The theme for the reflections this year is 'The Lord's Prayer: 10 lessons and one great hope' and in it Archbishop Stephen Cottrell invites us to reflect on prayer as something which, rather than being designed to change God's mind about something, is instead a practice which transforms us, so that by this transformation God's Kingdom might come more fully alive in our lives and our world.

Our world feels like it needs this hope more than ever, and as Christians, we are reminded that God invites us to join in the risky, challenging and yet ultimately fulfilling work of being bearers of that hope and of God's love to the world around us.

And so, let us join together in prayer and in action, as we pray "Your Kingdom Come".
