Lincoln Cathedral's theme for 2025 is 'Our Music: God's Song'. The year is a celebration of music in all its forms and the peace, joy and inspiration it brings to our lives. This weekend we are hosting the Lincoln Cathedral Choir Festival where we'll be joined by the choirs from Peterborough Cathedral, Grimsby Minster, Hull Minster, and Robinson College, Cambridge who will be performing an exceptional choral repertoire across services and recitals. It will indeed be a musical weekend to remember.

The people of God sing. The role of music in worship is biblical, the children of Israel sang a song to the Lord when they were escaping from the Egyptians and crossing the Red Sea. Singing was part of Israel's formal worship in both Tabernacle and temple where the Psalms bear rich testimony to that in joy and sorrow, in praise and lament, the faithful raise their voices in song to God. At Evensong every day the choir sing the Magnificat, one of the oldest Christian hymns, which is a prayer of thanksgiving and praise, expressing Mary's joy and her recognition of God's greatness and mercy. And today music continues to play a vital part in our daily worship at the Cathedral and we are privileged to have the talents of our choirs, organists and clergy who plan and assist in our worship day by day and week by week.

Music enables and enhances our worship, when we sing together it unites all of us as a community, as part of the body of Christ and opens our hearts, connecting us to each other and God in the deepest part of who we are.

During July and August, when our choir is on a well-deserved break, we are fortunate to host several visiting choirs from America, Utrecht and the United Kingdom to lead our worship. This is a chance to extend our musical welcome so please do come along and worship with us and support them.

I leave you with the words of Psalm 150 which the choir sing as they process out after the Sunday morning Eucharist.

Psalm 150

O praise God in his holiness; praise him in the firmament of his power. Praise him for his mighty acts; praise him according to his excellent greatness.

Praise him with the blast of the trumpet; praise him upon the harp and lyre. Praise him with timbrel and dances; praise him upon the strings and pipe. Praise him with ringing cymbals; praise him upon the clashing cymbals. Let everything that has breath praise the Lord.
