6pm, 20th July – St Hugh's Choir

An invitation from Dr Shirley Brook, Parish Secretary of St Mary Magdalene's: 'This service celebrates the historic links between the Cathedral and the Parish Church. For over two hundred years after the Cathedral's foundation in 1072, local people worshipped at the West End, using the Morning Chapel as their church. This continued until the opening of St Mary Magdalene's on its present site in 1317. A procession, led by the Parish Choir and the City of Lincoln Waites, will leave St Mary's, arriving at the great West Doors in time for Patronal Festival Evensong at 6pm. The procession returns to St Mary's after the service where there will be strawberry and cream scones and glasses of fizz. The Cathedral Congregation is warmly invited to join this service and celebration. The preacher this year is the Dean.'

Play the Organ Year 2025

A message from Jeffrey Makinson, Organist and Assistant Director of Music: 'Organisations from across the organ and church music world are working together to promote Play the Organ Year 2025, a year-long project to increase the number of people playing the organ and appreciating its music.

The Royal College of Organists is taking a lead on this, promoting the instrument through a varied range of concerts and tutorial courses throughout the year.

Here in Lincoln, I am pleased to report that there are currently four promising young students who are receiving organ tuition. Each of them is either choristers or former choristers in the cathedral choir: Feola Akinfenwa, Ben Brown, Elsa Peel-Cobas, and Isaac Turner. To enrich their learning experience, we are inviting each student to play a short organ voluntary after Evensong one day. Ben performed J.S. Bach's Prelude and Fugue in G minor, from the 'Short Eight' Preludes and Fugues. The other students will perform early on in Michaelmas Term. I will keep you informed when this happens. Any words of support and encouragement which you might be able to give to these young pupils would be hugely appreciated.'

THE NICENE CREED

All

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

OFFERTORY HYMN
