It's rooted in reality, the often messy reality of human lives. It's also rooted in Jesus Christ: 'Christ in you, the hope of glory', as St Paul puts it (Colossians 1.27). Trust in God's promises gives us this hope, which is not only about a future promise of eternal life; this trust also gives us a distinctive love-centred hope that enables us to live with a transformed perspective in the here and now.

For many who belong to other religious traditions and none, the need for hope is also deeply felt: not least hope that enables people to flourish personally and professionally, in relationships and as members of communities, in the face of the many significant challenges that exist in today's world.

With its hilltop position on a limestone ridge, Lincoln Cathedral rises above the city. Strategically chosen in the 11th century for visibility and defence, our strategic aim in the 21st century is not to provide a safe haven in which to shelter from the challenges beyond our doors, but to shine a light on them, the light of hope, and to draw people into the building to discover a community and a religious tradition that through its welcome and its worship offer hope to all.

In the coming years, there will be many opportunities for us to explore this theme and what it means for us to be part of such a community. For now, please join me in committing to a shared endeavour for Lincoln Cathedral to shine brightly as a beacon of hope for all.
